06 Visa Requirements



Traveling to Guadalajara for business or pleasure is easy.

Travelers who wish to visit Mexico (regardless of their nationality or itinerary), holding either a valid, multiple entry visa OR who are permanent residents in the United States of America, Canada, Japan, the United Kingdom, or the Schengen Area countries, among others, DO NOT require a Mexican tourist visa. Depending upon the immigration officer, the maximum period of stay is 180 days. However, the following documentation should be made available to immigration officials upon entering Mexico:

I. A Valid original passport or ID Travel Document.

II. Personal information requested by Immigration Authorities.

III. Travel justification. This information must be in line with the issued visa, if applicable. If traveling as a tourist, accreditation of economic solvency and hotel reservation (preferably paid) will be required. Accreditation of regular place of residence or origin.

IV. Address and period of stay in Mexico. It is important to present a return flight ticket to the country of origin and prove that hotel reservations are in line with the period of stay.

V. Information regarding the activities that will be carried out in Mexico as well as the ones undertaken in the country of origin.

VI. Proof of economic solvency for the period of stay in Mexico. It is strongly recommended to hold an international credit card.

The migration officer upon entering Mexico will review and stamp your valid and current passport or identity and travel document. On the stamp, the official will select the category of the traveler's stay (tourism, business, others) and will grant the traveler a period of stay up to 180 days.

Visa Appointment

For those visiting us from outside the previously-mentioned countries a visitor's visa can be easily acquired by following these steps: First, contact the Mexican Consular Office where you intend to apply, to obtain the requirements for your visa. Visa procedures are handled by appointment (one per person) through the "MiConsulado" portal (<https://citas.sre.gob.mx/>).

Applicants must select the desired procedure and request their appointment. Please note: The CITAS website may display a "no office found" / "oficina no disponible" message when appointments are unavailable. It is advisable to check the page regularly for upcoming availability or contact the consular office handling your application procedure.

Required documents:

- Original and copy of valid passport or ID Travel Document.
- One passport-size color photograph with the face clearly visible and looking directly at the camera. The photograph should be taken without glasses and against a white background.
- The photo should be at least 32.0 millimeters x 26 millimeters and 39.0 millimeters x 31.0 millimeters as maximum.
- Original and copy of the documents that prove legal status, if the foreign visitor is not a national of the country where the visa is requested.

The following documents, as applicable, in order to certify that the foreign visitor will not engage in gainful activities while in the country:

A. Settlement:

1. Original and copy of property deed of the duly registered properties under the name of the applicant or concerned person and proof of stable employment with at least two years of service, or

2. Original and copy of property deed of the duly registered properties under the name of the applicant or concerned person with at least 2 years of ownership and a document attesting to the property or participation in businesses issued by competent authorities of the respective country, with a minimum standing of two years.

B. Economic solvency:

1. Original and copy of a bank account statement or proof of investment with a monthly average balance equivalent to three hundred days of the current minimum wage of Mexico City (approximately \$3,204.00 USD) during the last three months, or

2. Original and copy of documents certifying employment or pension with a monthly net income of more than the equivalent of one hundred days of the current general minimum wage of Mexico City (approximately \$1,068.00 USD) during the last 3 months and one-year stable employment record; More information can be obtained from the Mexican Consular Offices; to find out which office is close to you please go to the following links:

07 Access & Transportation



Guadalajara's airport is the second most important destination for companies that belong to the largest airline alliances of the world.



Guadalajara International Airport is one of the busiest and most important airports in Mexico. It serves as a major hub for both domestic and international flights. The airport has two terminals: one for domestic flights and one for international flights and it is recognized for its modern facilities, efficient operations, and growing connectivity, with direct flights to numerous destinations in the United States, Central and South America, Canada and Europe.

The airport has undergone various expansions in recent years to accommodate the increasing passenger traffic, including a new terminal extension and improvements to passenger services and amenities. In 2025, Guadalajara International Airport continues to play a key role in boosting tourism and trade in the region.






At the Guadalajara International Airport you will be able to find different Taxi and Rental Car companies.

In the Metropolitan Area, there are 16,000 taxis, of which 5,000 are exclusively for tourist services. In terms of transportation, there is a bus stop just at the corner of the Center and taxi service is also offered by two taxi ranks that have collaborated with the venue for more than 20 years, for the comfort of the attendees the Center has a special area for passengers drop off and pick up.

UBER



Uber Technologies Inc. is a peer-to-peer ridesharing, food delivery, and transportation network company headquartered in San Francisco, California, with operations in 633 cities worldwide. Its platforms can be accessed via its websites and mobile apps.

Riders are quoted the fare that they will pay before requesting the ride. Uber uses a dynamic pricing model; prices vary based on projected time and distance as well as the time of day and the supply and demand for rides at the time the ride is requested.

DIDI



Didi Chuxing (formerly Didi Kuaidi) is a Chinese transportation company that connects users of its smartphone apps with vehicles and taxis for hire. With 7.43 billion rides completed in 2017, Didi Chuxing has quickly become China's premier ride-hailing service. Founded by Cheng Wei, Zhang Bo, and Wu Rui, the company caters to more than 450 million users and has established partnerships with seven of the world's top ridesharing companies: Grab, Lyft, Ola, Uber, Careem, 99, and Taxify. As part of its mission to "redefine the future of mobility," the company aims to use AI technology to help improve and evolve the transportation industry.

MIBICI



As a Government initiative from the Environment and Sustainable Life program in the city of Guadalajara, comes a strategy to implement and support public bicycle programs: MIBICI.

MIBICI is a system based on the rental of bicycles for short periods of time that allows the possibility of traveling in a certain area. Currently the system works in the central areas of the municipalities Guadalajara, Zapopan and Tlaquepaque. MIBICI allows the cyclist to ride for 30 minutes without any additional charge before parking it in a station.

As part of its mission to "redefine the future of mobility," the company aims to use AI technology to help improve and evolve the transportation industry.

Urban Electric Train (SITEUR)

SITEUR is a light train and rapid transit system serving the municipalities of Guadalajara, Zapopan and Tlaquepaque. The system currently has three lines: line 1, which runs north to south, with 19 stations, line 2, which runs from downtown to the east, with 10 stations, and in 2020, The 22-kilometer line 3 was inaugurated, serving 18 stations.

Macrobus

The Macrobus Express Service, which has 12 stations, is part of the Guadalajara Metropolitan Area's mass transit network, covering over 103 kilometers of routes throughout the inner city.




Integrated Electronic Payment System

All modes of public transportation in the city are integrated and can be accessed using a single transportation card. These cards can be purchased and recharged throughout the Guadalajara Metropolitan Area at 696 convenience stores and more than 800 points of sale as well as at train and mi Macro stations.

Transportation card usage has grown by almost 460% since 2016.
